Magnetar Multiverse

Magnetar Multiverse is an Astrophysics based Virtual Alternate Reality platform featuring the "Worlds in Worlds" paradigm, with applications ranging from massive multiplayer online (MMO) games to scientific simulations.

The cornerstone of the technology is a distributed scene graph SURF (Synthetic Universe Representation Foundation), which adopts the ISO/IEC SEDRIS standards and the IEEE/SISO HLA standard, and is implemented as a Virtual World Framework (VWF) product.

Magnetar Multiverse is designed to interface with and create interoperability between Virtual World and MMO platforms including Open Simulator, Multiverse and High Fidelity. The web3D "Voyager" viewer component of the Magnetar Multiverse is designed to support real time collaboration by small teams of content creators using very high level domain specific editors and is specifically designed for planetary scale terrains/environments with a focus on procedurally generated content.
